EOFY Appeal: *Sponsor an Organ Pipe*

Our magnificent 1884 Walker pipe organ is currently being restored. We are deeply grateful to all who have contributed to the organ fund in the past, but there is still some way to go before we reach the full amount needed. To help meet our target, we are launching a *Sponsor a Pipe* campaign for the 27 pipes in the front row of the organ. These are all ‘speaking’ pipes — meaning that when the organ is played, you are likely to hear the very pipe you have sponsored.

Pipes range in price from \$500 (for the smallest) to \$5,000 (for the largest), with a variety of sponsorship levels available for the 24 pipes in between. All donations are tax-deductible. Sponsors will have their name and the location of their pipe engraved on a plaque mounted on the side of the organ. To secure your sponsorship, please first contact Angus Harker. Once your pipe selection has been confirmed, payment can then be made via the National Trust St Andrew’s 1884 Walker Organ, South Brisbane Account using the details below.

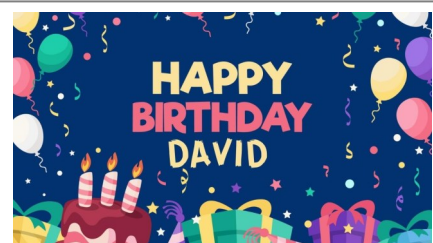
So, how can you help? There are a number of ways:

Thank you to everyone who has supported our Food Parcel Ministry. Over the years, St Andrew's has distributed food parcels, containing the items shown in the pictures below, to those in urgent need. Without your support, this ministry would not continue, as it relies 100% on your generous donations. We are now asking for your ongoing donations of non-perishable food items listed below:

Suggested Non-Perishable Food Items

- Tinned Baked Beans, Spaghetti, Tuna, meat/vegetables (meal), and Soup (please ensure tins are easy to open)
- Long-life Milk (preferably full cream)
- Two-minute Instant Noodles
- Oats Quick Sachets
- Coffee sticks, Sugar sticks, Tea bags (stick-type items are preferred for hygiene reasons)
- Muesli Bars and individual Fruit tubs
- Any other non-perishable food items (except sauces) are all welcome!



How You Can Help

There are several ways you can contribute:

1. **Food Donations:** Please drop off your food items in the **Pantry Box** located in the Hall, Blue Room, or Club Room whenever you visit the church. We will collect and pack the items on a weekly basis.
 2. **Monetary Donations:** You can donate online by clicking the *Give Now* button on the upper right of the church website and selecting "To Welfare (Pantry Appeal)".
 3. **Bank Transfers** are also appreciated—please mention 'Food Parcel' in the reference.
 4. **Envelopes:** You can also donate by using an empty envelope marked "Food Parcel Ministry" on Sundays.
 5. **Eftpos:** The Church *Eftpos* machine is available in the Church Office during the week for donations. *Credit card donations over the phone are also available*
