Youth Group Camp

We had a lovely Youth Group Camp from the afternoon of 1 Friday 1 to Sunday 3 May on the Sunshine Coast near Coolum. Ten Youth Groupers and four leaders enjoyed kayaking and mini electric and paddle boats at Maroochydore, climbing Mt Coolum, walking 2km to Coolum Beach and body boarding, as well as spending time together having meals, playing totem and table tennis, and board games. We investigated the story of the Good Samaritan and after acting it out, considered how we could respond to the question “Who is my neighbour?” Each camp is such a special time as we experience a community of acceptance, care, and God’s love which touches each of us.

Some of the YGers’ comments at the end of camp as we shared our favourite activities, feelings and needs that were met included: *I loved ...the kayaking, boogie boarding, acting the Good Samaritan story. I felt ... grateful, included, peaceful, relaxed, happy, appreciative, joyful. A need that was met was for...fun, care, good food, friendship, connection, community.*

Thanks once again to the GFS (Girls Friendly Society) for their generous grant of \$1,000 which made the camp affordable for our Youth Group families. Thank you all for your prayers for a safe and happy camp which enriched the lives of our young people as we shared God's love with them.

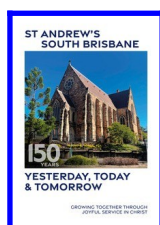
